

Bibliography in Spanish of the Works of James Churchward

The works in the Spanish language of the multifaceted author James Churchward (February 27, 1851 - January 4, 1936), correspond to *El Continente Perdido de Mu, la Patria del Hombre* (“The Lost Continent of Mu, the Motherland of Men”, 1926), *Los Hijos de Mu* (“The Children of Mu”, 1931), *Los Símbolos Sagrados de Mu* (“The Sacred Symbols of Mu”, 1933) and *Mu, Fuerzas Cóslicas* (“Cosmic Forces as They Taught in Mu”, 1934).

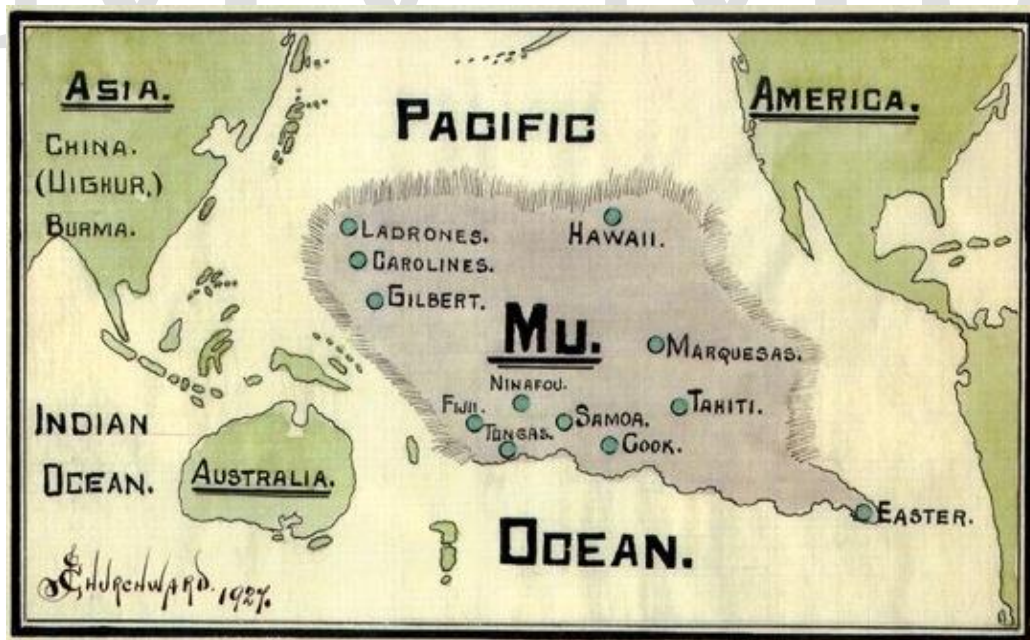
However, *Second Book of Cosmic Forces of Mu* (1935) remains still unpublished in Spanish.

Nor, the two posthumously published works, *The Books of the Golden Age* (written in 1927 and appeared in 1997) and *Copies of Stone Tablets Found by William Niven at Santiago Ahuizotla Near Mexico City* (written in 1927 and published in 2014 and included in *The Stone Tablets of Mu* by Jack Churchward, great-grandson of author), have appeared in Spanish.

James Churchward’s books have been published in Spain, Colombia and Mexico. The first publication corresponds precisely to Churchward’s first work: *The Lost Continent of Mu, the Motherland of Men*, which appeared in Barcelona in 1978.

This bibliography follows a chronological order¹.

¹ It should be noted that with the exception of *El continente perdido de Mu* (“The Lost Continent of Mu”), published by the A. T. E. Publishing House in Barcelona in 1978, James Churchward’s works do not appear in the catalogs of the National Libraries of Spain, Colombia and Mexico, countries where his works have been published.

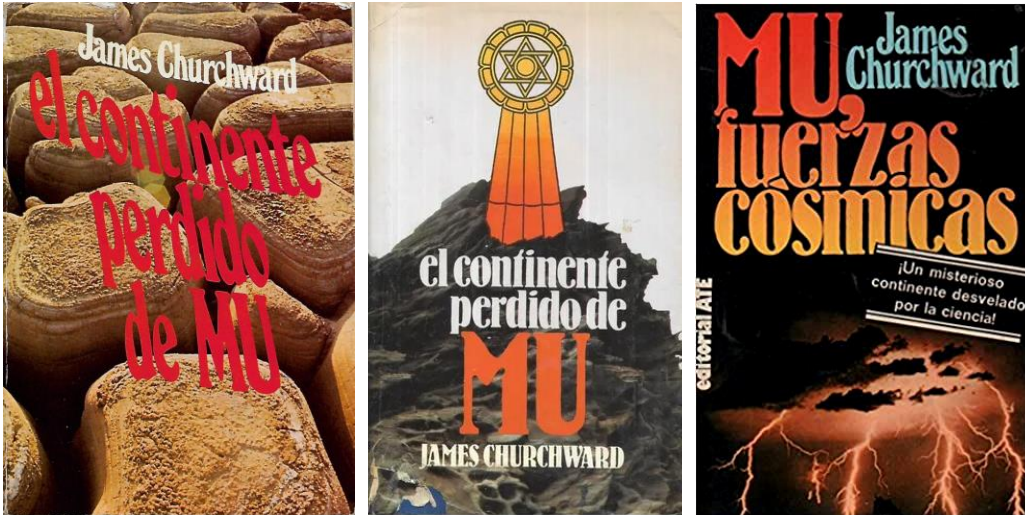

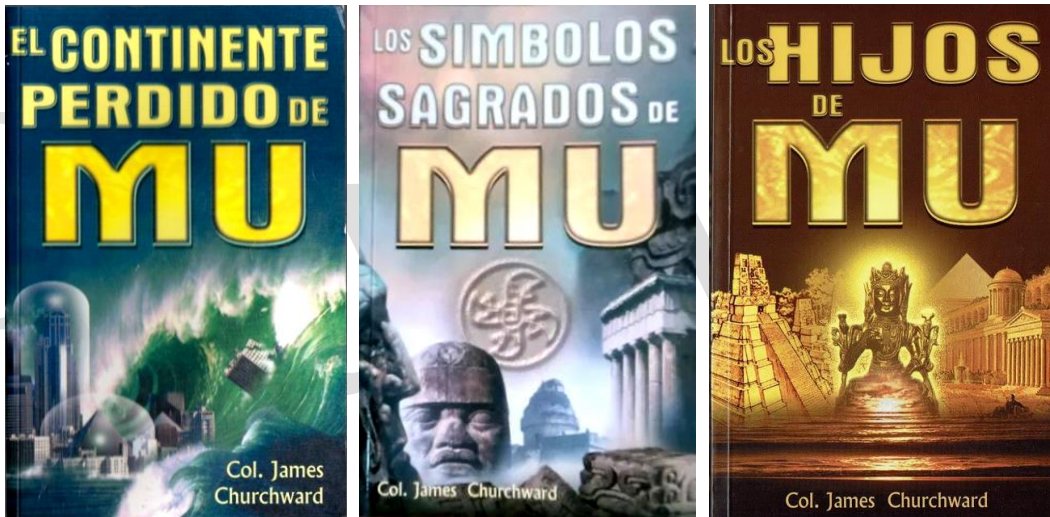

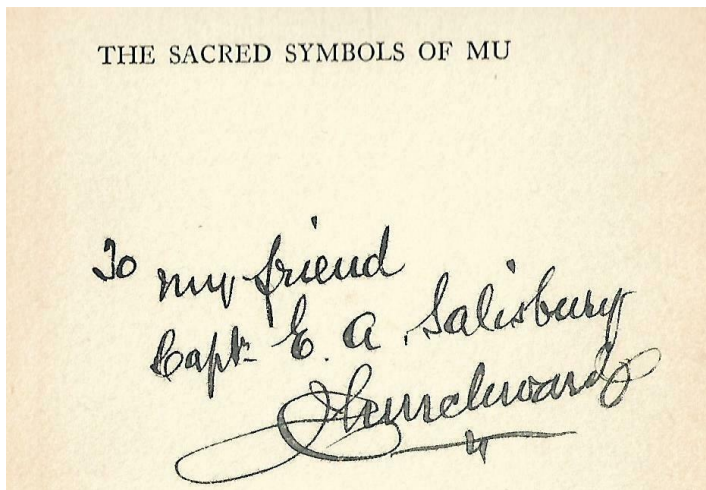
